- Helmet should sit level on your head and low on your forehead
- Adjust the strap sliders below the ear on both sides.
- Buckle the chin strap. Adjust strap until it is snug.
- No more than two fingers should fit between the strap and your chin.
- A proper fitting helmet should be comfortable and not rock forward/backward or side to side.
- Always read the user manual that comes with your helmet to make sure it is fitted and attached properly to the wearer's head according to the fitting instructions described in the user manual.

- Ajuste la correa controles deslizantes por debajo de la oreja en ambos lados.
- Hebille el barboquejo. Ajustar la tira hasta que quede bien ajustado.

- El uso de un casco a su medida debe de ser cómodo y no estar moviéndose hacia delante o hacia atrás o de lado a lado.
- Siempre lea el manual del usuario que viene con su casco para asegurarse de que se encuentra instalado y conectado correctamente a la cabeza de acuerdo con el manual de montaje se describe en el manual del usuario.
- Casque devrait siéger niveau sur votre tête et faible sur votre front.
- Régler la sangle curseurs au-dessous de l'oreille des deux côtés.
- Boucle de la jugulaire. Régler l'attache jusqu'à ce qu'elle soit serrée.
- Pas plus de deux doigts devraient monter entre la sangle et le menton.
- Un bon raccord casque doit être confortable et pas rock avant/arrière ou de côté à côté.
- Toujours lire le manuel d'utilisation fourni avec votre casque pour s'assurer qu'il est monté et fixé correctement à la tête du porteur selon la notice de montage décrit dans le manuel de l'utilisateur.

- Ridden by more than one person at a time
- Rented, sold, or given away

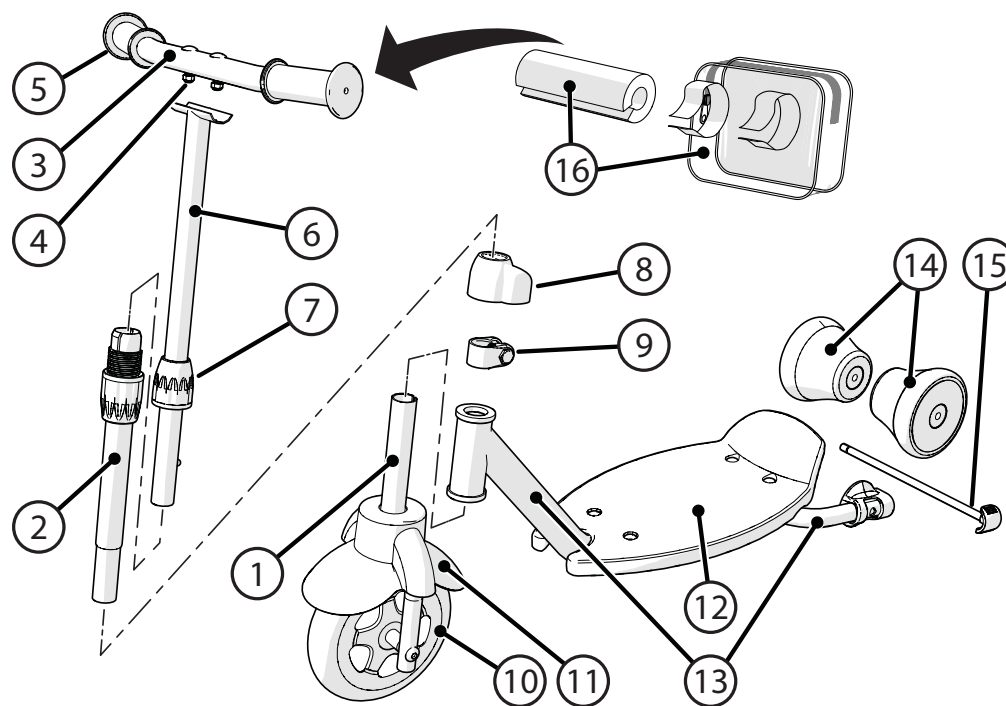
### What rights do you have?

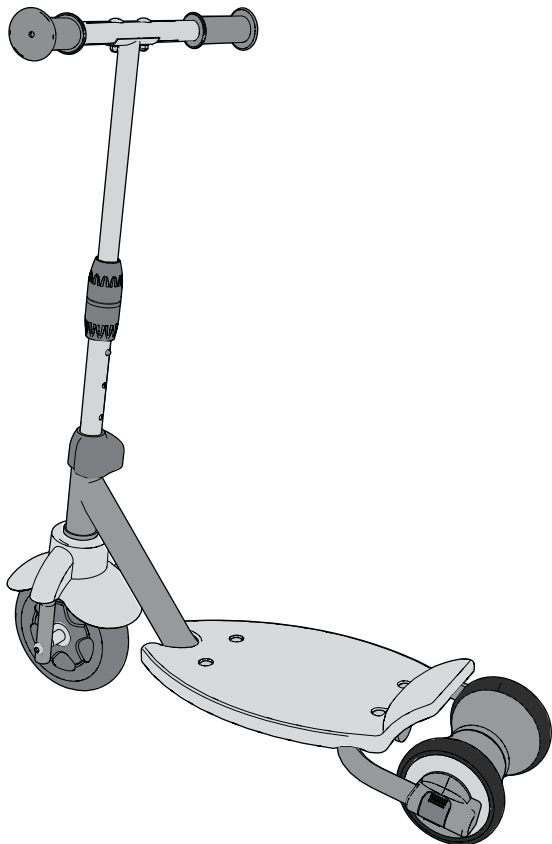

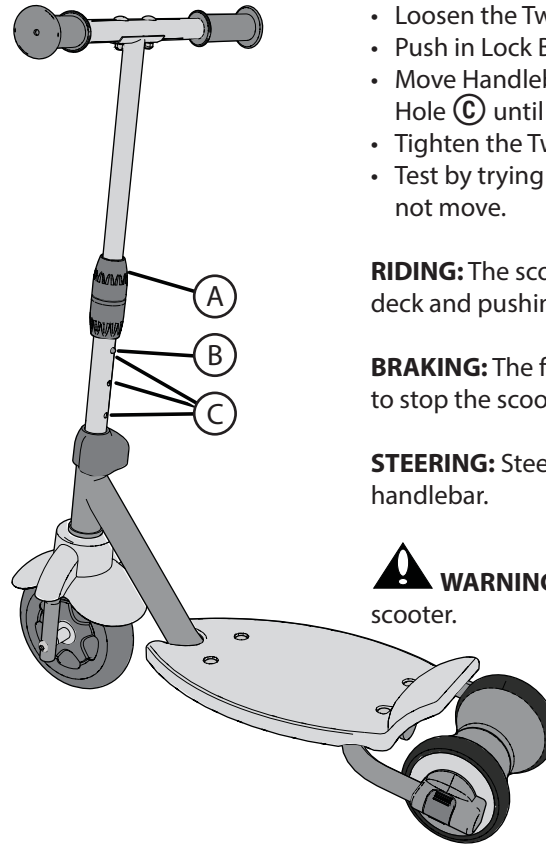

## Operating the Scooter




### ADJUSTING THE HANDLEBAR:

- Loosen the Twist Clamp (A).
- Push in Lock Button (B),
- Move Handlebar up or down to the desired Positioning Hole (C) until the Lock Button snaps into place.
- Tighten the Twist Clamp (A) hand tight.
- Test by trying to move Handlebar up or down. It should not move.

**RIDING:** The scooter is operated by placing one foot on the deck and pushing with the other foot.

**BRAKING:** The foot used to propel the scooter is also used to stop the scooter.

**STEERING:** Steering is accomplished by turning the handlebar.

 **WARNING:** Always wear shoes when riding the scooter.

## Repair and Service

### **WARNING:**

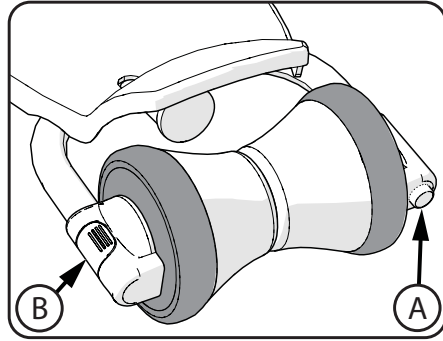
- Inspect the product frequently. Failure to inspect the product and to make repairs or adjustments, as necessary, can result in injury to the rider or to others. Make sure all parts are correctly assembled and adjusted as written in this manual and any "Special Instructions".
- Immediately replace any damaged, missing, or badly worn parts with original equipment.
- Make sure all fasteners are correctly tightened as written in this manual and any "Special Instructions". Parts that are not tight enough can be lost or operate poorly. Over tightened parts can be damaged. Make sure any replacement fasteners are the correct size and type.

**NOTE:** Have a bicycle service shop make any repairs or adjustments for which you do not have the correct tools or if the instructions in this manual or any "Special Instructions" are not sufficient for you.

## Changing from 3-Wheel to 2-Wheel Scooter

### STEPS:

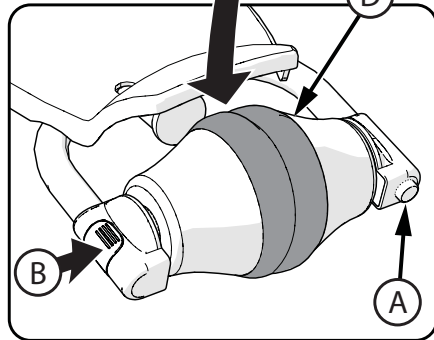
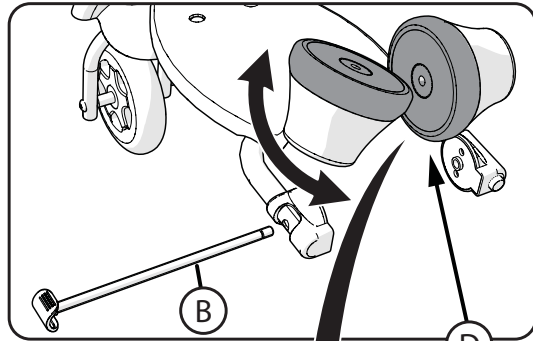
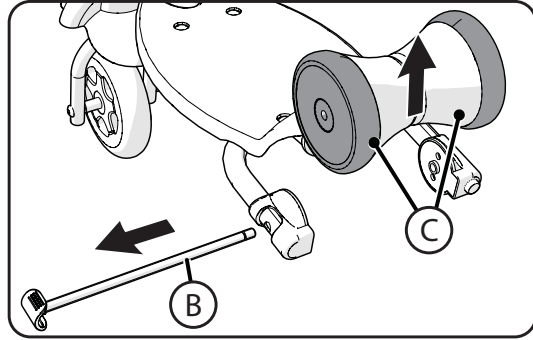
- Push Release/Lock Button **(A)** and pull out Locking Axle **(B)**.
- Pull both Wheels **(C)** straight out.
- Turn each Wheel over so Tread is now in the center as shown **(D)**.
- Place together and insert between Rear Forks so that all holes line up.
- Reinsert Locking Axle **(B)** through Fork side, both Wheels and opposite Fork side.
- While holding IN Release/Lock Button **(A)**, snap Locking Axle firmly into place.



- To change Wheels back, do these steps again, but turn each Wheel so that Tread is on the outside.

### NOTES:

- To test, try to pull out Locking Axle. It should not release.
- Make sure Wheels turn freely after changing.



### ⚠️ WARNING:

2-wheel scooters are not as stable as 3-wheel scooters. Make sure your child can operate the scooter safely.

## Safety and Warning Information

This product, like all wheeled vehicles, will provide safe, enjoyable transportation and recreation when used and maintained properly. Like bicycling, skateboarding, and in-line skating, riding this product can be dangerous even under the best of circumstances. We do not want you to get hurt. Please follow these safety rules.

**⚠️** This symbol is important. It is the WARNING symbol. The warning symbol precedes safety instructions. Make sure the child understands these instructions. Failure to follow these instructions may result in injury to the rider or to others, or damage to the product.

### ⚠️ WARNING TO AVOID SERIOUS INJURY:

- Adult assembly required.
- CHOKING HAZARD: Small parts. Not for children under 3 years.
  - Keep small loose parts and plastic bags out of the reach of children.
  - Not suitable for children under 3 years as foam pieces may break off and pose a choking hazard.
- An adult must unfold and fold this product (as equipped).
- Continuous adult supervision required.
- Never use near motor vehicles.
- Never ride with more than one person (unless equipped with rear step).
- Excessive weight may cause a hazardous or unstable condition.
- Protective equipment should be worn.
- Do not allow a child to ride without a CPSC approved helmet, with the chinstrap securely fastened.
- Always wear shoes when using this product.
- Not to be use in traffic.
- Do not allow a child to ride the product at dusk, at night or at times of limited visibility.
- Do not allow a child to ride on roadways or alleys.
- Do not allow a child to ride off road, on grass or wet surfaces.
- Never use near streets, swimming pools (or other bodies of water), hills, steps, or sloped driveways.
- For use on smooth paved surfaces only.
- Understand all operating procedures before use.
- Do not tow or pull any objects with the product.
- Do not push or pull a child riding on the product.
- Use with caution, since skill is required to avoid falls or collisions causing injury to the user or third parties.
- Always comply with local laws and regulations.
- If anything does not operate properly, discontinue use.
- Replace worn or broken parts immediately with genuine replacement parts.
- Handlebar hand grip or tube end plugs should be replaced if damaged as bare tubes have been known to cause injury. All products with capped handlebar ends should be checked regularly to ensure that adequate protection for the ends of the handlebars are in place.

## Assemble the Fork and Handlebar

### STEP ONE:

- Place Fender (A) onto Fork Assembly (B) and insert up into frame Headtube (C) with Clamp Slot (D) facing BACK.
- Ensure Headtube Bushings (E) are fully seated.
- Place Clamp (F) fully down onto Fork Tube (D).

### STEP TWO:

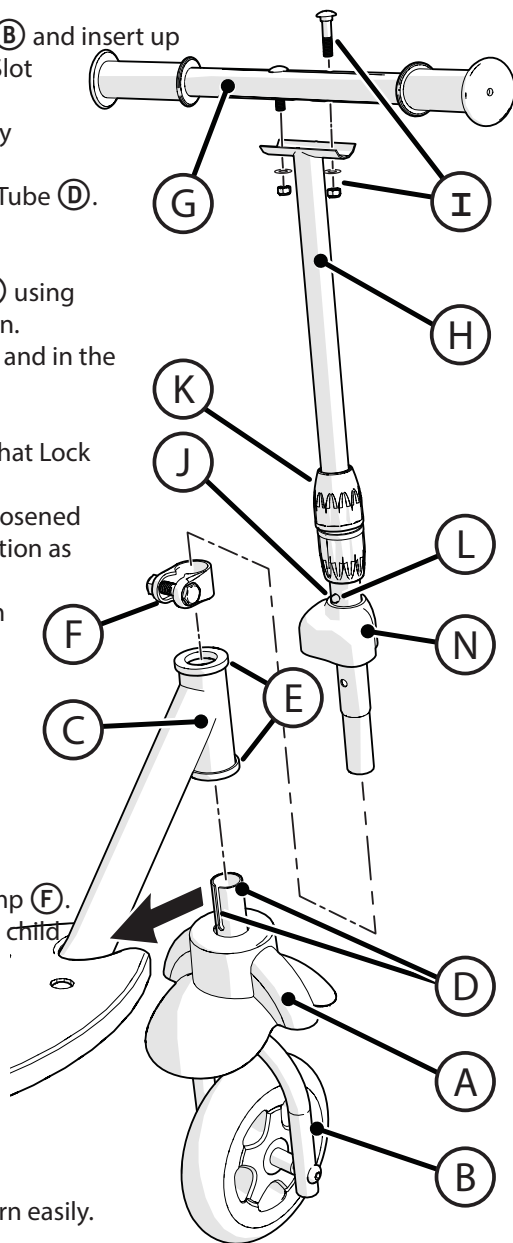
- Attach Handlebar (G) to Steer Tube (H) using Screws, Washers and Nuts (I) as shown.
- Make sure handlebar curves **BACK** - and in the same direction as Lock Button (J).
- Tighten Nuts (I) securely.
- Ensure that Handlebar is adjusted so that Lock Button (J) is in TOP position (L).
- **NOTE:** Clamp (K) may need to be loosened - reference Adjusting Handlebar section as needed.
- Slide Clamp Cover (N) up onto bottom Steer Tube.
- Install this assembly down into Fork Tube (D) fully.
- Align Handlebar with Fork/Wheel Assembly and tighten Clamp (F) securely.

### STEP THREE:

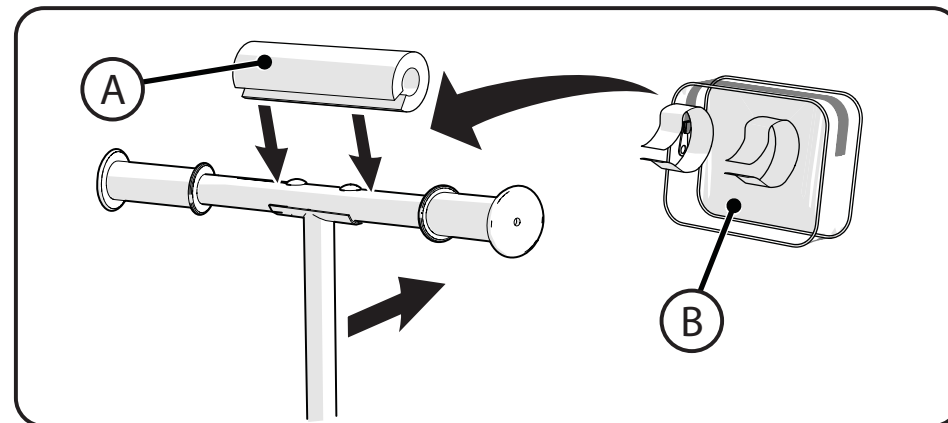
- Slide Clamp Cover (N) down over Clamp (F).
- Adjust Handlebar to correct height for child using Lock Button (J) and Positioning Holes.
- Slide Twist Clamp top (K) down onto Bottom Twist Clamp and tighten hand-tight.

### ⚠️ WARNINGS:

- Ensure Handlebar and Front Wheel, turn easily.



## Handlebar Bags/Pads (various models)



- Attach Handlebar Pad (A) (if equipped) to Handlebar by opening and placing straight down over handlebar and using Hook & Loop Straps to secure. Fasten securely.
- Attached Handlebar Bag (B) (if equipped) by securing bag straps around Handlebar/Bag. Fasten securely.

Bag Weight Limit: 5 lbs (2.3 kgs)
